Nilfisk launch: Very High Pressure washers – extreme in power

Nilfisk – a leading supplier of professional cleaning equipment – are introducing two new **very high pressure (VHP) washers** designed to handle the toughest cleaning tasks in the professional segment.

The two new high-pressure washers - MC 9P and MC 10P provide up to five times the amount of power of traditional high-pressure washers and are uniquely designed to perform in extreme conditions such as marine/Off-shore or construction sites. Both variants are 3rd party certified to meet EN standards.

"We experience a high demand for machines uniquely designed to handle extremely tough cleaning jobs in harsh conditions. The MC 9P takes care of the tight spaces that can be difficult to access while the MC 10P tackles tough cleaning and surface preparation of ships or other marine constructions. We are thrilled to be able to offer these high-performance machines", Andreas Hagbarth, says.

Agile cleaning in tight spaces

The MC 9P is specifically designed to get around narrow corners, into aisles and in ship cargo holds - to get the maximum clean possible.

"High pressure washing of ship decks, cargo holds, and corridors is made much easier with a machine that is highly portable, sturdy and powerful enough to remove grime, oil, rust and other caked-on substances you find onboard ships and in shipping containers", says Andreas Hagbarth, Group Product Manager at Nilfisk.

The MC 9P has been designed for maximum maneuverability in narrow areas, as well as integrated crane lift capability for easy transport on and off vessels.

Mobile high pressure washing for extreme cleaning

The MC 10P delivers extremely powerful high pressure washer power designed to tackle tough jobs like cleaning or preparing surfaces for repairs of ship exteriors, hulls, and decks. The MC 10P tackles difficult tasks using up to 1100 Bars of cleaning power to help crews maintain equipment, eliminate oil, and grime or remove cement from surfaces with ease.

"Ship exteriors are exposed to harsh weather conditions almost year-round and require constant cleaning to remain in proper working order. Having the right cleaning machine to maintain exposed surfaces and eliminate rust grime and other deteriorating substances is key to keeping ships afloat", Andreas Hagbarth continues.

The MC 10P can even be used to clear concrete and other stuck-on materials from scaffolds and surfaces or water blast surfaces on construction sites.
